Anythink Wright Farms Library Opens with Historic Fanfare

The new library in Wright Farms opens to the public on Saturday, July 10, with ceremonies and fun activities for the whole family, from 1-6 pm. Anythink Wright Farms is a 45,000-square foot library – the largest facility in the Rangeview Library District. The official ribbon-cutting is slated to take place in front of the main entrance at 120th Avenue and Kearney Way.

Freedom to Dream

The theme of the library grand opening is “Freedom to Dream: Honoring Ideas Sparked in Libraries Since 1776” and focuses on the role that American public libraries have played throughout history in encouraging freedom of thought and the exchange of ideas.

Wright Farms individuals, family groups, educators, community leaders and organizations are invited to pose with balloons, banners and placards in the gigantic ribbon-cutting panoramic photograph that will be taken at 1 pm.

Visitors will be able to tour the magnificent new library, get a new library card, check out books, movies and music CDs, or sign up for the new mySummer reading and activity programs. Residents can also enjoy the quiet study rooms and lounges, indoor/outdoor fireplace reading area, teen space, children’s library, computer lab and beautifully landscaped park and gardens made possible with the support of the Wright Farms Metropolitan District.

Fun Activities Galore

Activities include an interactive timeline where people can enter significant achievements from their own lives onto a timeline alongside other notable events such as the opening of the first lending library in Colorado (on a table under a cottonwood tree in Auraria in 1859), and the first summer reading program (Cleveland Library, 1895), and the publishing of the first American novel (“The Power of Sympathy” by William Hill Brown, 1789). Other features will include representative libraries of Thomas Jefferson, Rangeview Library Board President Kay Riddle, Wright Farms Project Manager Chandra Jones, and Wright Farms youngster Zach Zorack.

Teens will get to create their own personal manifestos while younger children fashion their own flags as part of special drop-in craft opportunities available inside the library. While outside, visitors will experience demonstrations of traditional homesteading arts like bee-keeping, gardening, food preserving and brewing. A drum engagement offers an opportunity for 100 area residents of all ages to learn about the meaning and uses of drums throughout history and participate in a synchronized percussion performance that expresses the community’s joy at opening their new library. The afternoon’s entertainments will be capped with a concert on the great lawn by John Common and the Blinding Flashes of Light from 5-6 pm.

The library grand opening is free and open to the public. Refreshments will be available.
